


About us

How we work

We work continuously with the objective to strengthen our ability to respond effectively to new crisis, and through our programmes we reach the most vulnerable affected people in areas that are hard to reach and support people with the most priority needs. In our programmes, IYCY provision humanitarian assistance to most affected people through implementing several projects in different sectors and improve access of people to life saving humanitarian services such as Health , Nutrition, Wash , Food Security, Shelters, Education and Protection.

Reaching Those Most In Need

IYCY Commitment to reach the most vulnerable affected and disadvantaged populations in conflict affected areas where the war between the conflict parties have devastated the lives of millions of people and forced people to displace from their homes. IYCY focuses on people most affected by the crisis and most need to the lifesaving services.

IYCY's interventions is carried out on the basis of need alone, giving priority to the most urgent cases of distress and making no distinctions on the basis of nationality, race, gender, religious belief, class or political opinions. IYCY reach the most vulnerable affected populations who lack for basic services and improved equitable access to quality integrated package of life-saving services in several sectors. IYCY works in coordination with INGOs, LNGOs, Government Official Offices and Community Leaders for gaining access to areas that are hard to reach because of security or other issues, is a priority for IYCY. Hence , we are increasing our access where few humanitarian actors are present.

Security and humanitarian access

As we operate in areas affected by armed conflict, ensuring security for staff and the people we help is a priority. All operations continually analyse risk levels and types of risk, and put in place concrete measures to minimise possible threats. The most essential measure to minimise risk is building trust and acceptance among local communities, by ensuring that our programme activities are based on humanitarian needs and that we remain impartial, neutral and independent of political agendas.

Generally , International Youth Council-Yemen believes that the development and achievement can not be fulfilled unless the efforts directed towards change at three level : individual , community , and society .

At the individual level, this entails a change in a person's mindset. This is where the greatest change takes place. The result is a growing sense of selfesteem, increased self-confidence, and confidence in the future. This helps people take responsibility for themselves and for their families, to explore opportunities for utilising their talents and to work to improve their living conditions as well as those of the community as a whole.

At community level, we bring individuals together and help them develop structures for improving basic services. We have a specific focus on marginalized groups, such as the elderly and those who are disabled or suffering from chronic illness. We work closely with the community to develop social safety nets for people, such that the community itself takes responsibility for caring for these at-risk groups.

At the societal level, we encourage partnership with government agencies, private organisations, and businesses. We believe it is important that change taking place at an individual and community level should also be embedded in broader institutions. This helps foster lasting change. In particular , International Youth Council-Yemen concerns much about youth as they are hence considered the first priority . Youth are considered the most important component in the society , they indeed play a vital role in the development.

Apparently , Yemeni Youth has been facing several challenges , most importantly lack of capacities , unemployment , weak engagement in decision making authorities . Thus , without special attention paid to

youth , they were unable to develop their skills and tools to achieve more influence and contribution .

Since 2012 IYCY has worked efficiently to strengthen and empower youth which in turn would associate in achieving the society sustainable development . in particular , IYCY has been working in three main strategic objectives as follows :

1. Building youth capacity and skills in different aspects .
2. Empower youth economically , politically , and socially .
3. Increase youth mobilization and engagement in the society .

As result , Youth responded very effectively to the crisis which started in Yemen march 2015 through IYCY humanitarian response programs and projects which were successfully able to reach more than 1.5 million in term of saving their lives and provide the basic needs to them in the affected governorate and districts . It is significant to mention that IYCY rely of the strategy that emphasizes on the youth role to be the core of any intervention or response .

In fact , this integration has led to real investment in youth and build their skills as well as their ability to managing crisis and emergencies . In this sense , IYCY is continuing this approach and increases its efforts to support youth and maximize their positive power and enrollment .

As a summary , the fruits of this approach are seen in the way people and communities begin to flourish. We see dignity, hope and strength renewed, with people becoming more resilient. Strong, inclusive and dynamic community structures are developed. Governments and administrations become more and more responsible. Living conditions become more safe and peaceful. There is access to basic services, such as healthcare and clean drinking water.



PROGRAM

IYCY is a Youth Leading organization in Yemen which dedicate its efforts to empower, enable and build Yemen institutional, stable and sustainable driven by young Yemeni people for Supporting comprehensive sustainable development to contribute to the building of civil society through the development of youth capacities and strengthening the institutional capacities of existing and emerging organizations. to achieve IYCY strategic objectives IYCY will focus on the ground needs, with consolidating the new direction and the progress made under Strategic Plan three mutually reinforcing aims have been formulated for the next three years.

1. Address humanitarian needs by provide life-saving assistance to people in need, prioritizing the most vulnerable.

Growing numbers of people in Yemen need humanitarian assistance to ensure their basic survival, as illustrated by major increases in severe food insecurity, acute malnutrition, lack of clean water, displacement and declining health services. In 2017-2019, IYCY primary objective will be to provide life-saving assistance, prioritizing the most vulnerable across the 7 governorates.

2. Contribute to promote and advocate protection, access and accountability to and for affected people.

IYCY in 2017-2019 will incorporate protection concerns across the humanitarian response, ensuring that all assistance is delivered in a way that promotes the safety and dignity of those it serves.

3. Ensure that all response activities promote equitable access to assistance for women, girls, boys and men.

Humanitarian assistance is delivered strictly based on needs. However, needs-based assistance must also be delivered equitably if it is to be effective. Building on progress in developing gender- and age-sensitive plans, IYCY in 2017-2019 will ensure that these plans are translated into equitable access to assistance for women, girls, boys and men during implementation. Support and tools will be provided to ensure gender and age considerations are incorporated across the programme cycle.

4. Ensure that humanitarian action supports resilience and sustainable recovery.

IYCY will ensure to demonstrate the need to link humanitarian assistance to recovery. In 2017-2019, IYCY will undertake a limited set of humanitarian activities to support resilience and sustainable recovery. These efforts will mainly focus on strengthening capacity of IYCY humanitarian respond; and supporting livelihoods in affected areas

IYCY's strategy plan remains focused on delivering lifesaving services and supplies in line with IYCY's Core Commitments to people in Emergencies. This includes providing an integrated package of health, nutrition, WASH, food and protection. IYCY and partners are scaling up efforts to reach the most vulnerable people. In light of the huge impact of poverty on people, targeted health, nutrition, WASH, food and protection grants reach millions of the most vulnerable families in Yemen. IYCY continues to generate new evidence on geographic vulnerabilities, effectiveness of early relief efforts and remaining gaps in lifesaving interventions.

IYCY will continue to work closely with local government providers to improve their capacity to respond to the ongoing crisis. IYCY's strategy plan prioritizes actions in such a way that supplies and services are directed to governorates with high levels of the most disadvantaged population

HEALTH PROGRAMME

The ongoing conflict has led to collapse of Yemen's health system, including infrastructure, leading to a catastrophic situation, leaving more than 15.2 million people in need of access to basic health care. IYCY is implementing an integrated package of health and nutrition services for vulnerable and internal displaced people.

Through our Health activities, we:

- Provide integrated primary health service delivery and medical supplies in affected areas.
- Strengthen reproductive, maternal, newborn and child health (RMNCH) interventions, and protect children and women against violence.
- Support community based health initiatives and sustain the health system pillars and infrastructure.

We ensure people in Yemen can access Health by:

- Strengthen early warning surveillance and response system for outbreak-prone diseases
- Strengthen referral system
- Identify and conduct trainings for health workers to provide basic medical care to populations in emergency situations
- Refresher trainings on management of diarrheal diseases
- Pre-positioning of medical kits, RH kits and emergency supplies in high risk areas
- Conduct health promotion and prevention campaigns
- Recruitment of short-term temporary emergency health workers
- Ensure all primary facilities receive regular supply of drugs and other medical and non-medical consumables.
- Ensure provision of alimentary supplies for inpatients.

WATER AND SANITATION PROGRAM

The Water and Sanitation sector in Yemen continues to face enormous challenges. The conflict is placing immense pressure on water supplies and creating a breakdown in sanitation services across both urban and rural areas. We are working with communities to ensure that water is stored and managed safely.

We improve access to safe and sufficient water and sanitation facilities, and promote better hygiene and fight preventable disease, especially to vulnerable communities

We ensure people in Yemen can access safe water by:

- Rehabilitating water supply systems in both the urban or rural settings
- Developing water supply wells for water abstraction
- Trucking safe water communities in areas with acute emergencies.
- Conducting hygiene information dissemination for improved hygiene practices
- Improving sanitation facilities
- Constructing latrines/toilets that meet the sanitation needs of the displacement affected households

NUTRITION PROGRAMME

About 3.3 million children and pregnant or lactating women are acutely malnourished, including 462,000 children under 5 suffering from severe acute malnutrition. This represents a 57 per cent increase since late 2015 and threatens the lives and life-long prospects of those affected.

Through our Nutrition activities, we:

- Improve equitable access to quality life-saving services for acutely malnourished children and mothers*
- Prevent under-nutrition among children and mothers* in 7 governorates
- Strengthen capacity of relevant authorities and local partners to ensure effective nutrition response.

We support improved access to Nutrition by:

- Treatment of severe acute malnutrition children 6-59 months
- Treatment of moderate acute malnutrition in children 6-59 months
- Treatment of acute malnutrition in pregnant and lactating mothers
- Micronutrient supplements for girls and boys (6-24 months) not enrolled in community-based management of acute malnutrition(CMAM) or BSFP
- Blanket supplementary feeding programme
- Counselling for mothers/care takers of children under 2 in Infant and Young Child feeding (IYCF) practices
- Screening: Detection and referral (girls and boys) under five and PLW
- Capacity development conducted for MoPHP staff and community volunteers
- Emergency nutrition assessments and coverage evaluation (SMART) and (SQUEAC) (Target: Number of assessments)
- Emergency nutrition assessments and coverage evaluation (SMART) and (SQUEAC) (Target: Number of assessments)

FOOD SECURITY AND AGRICULTURE PROGRAMME

The conflict in Yemen have exacted a dreadful toll on civilians, who urgently require assistance to protect their lives and fundamental rights. Yemen Already mired in a humanitarian crisis when violence escalated in march, 2015 ,now 21.2 million people or four in five residents in need of some kind of humanitarian assistance. This includes 14.4 million people unable to meet their food needs and this humanitarian needs is escalating day after day in Yemen

Through our food security and Agriculture activities, we:

- Strive to improve peoples' living conditions and access to food and livelihood .
- Improve availability of and access to food for the most vulnerable
- Improve food security by supporting agricultural, livestock and fishery systems and assets
- Strengthen capacity of partners, communities and authorities on preparedness and response

We support improved access to safe, nutritious food by:

- Distributing food
- Providing unconditional cash transfers to families in need
- Providing start-up capital and training for youth and women entrepreneurs
- Supporting trainings on food security and agricultural production
- Providing livelihood and rehabilitation support for people returning home
- In-kind foods are complemented by a cash-based emergency food security program that allows IYCY to buy some food locally and regionally. The cash program also allows IYCY to support interventions that enable hungry people to access local markets.

The conflict in Yemen continues to force families to flee their homes, which leaves more than 2.5 million internally displaced people and other affected population require immediate assistance across 21 governorates.

About 11.3 million people need assistance to protect their safety, dignity or basic rights, including 2.9 million people living in acutely affected areas. Vulnerable people require legal, psychosocial and other services, including child protection and gender-based violence support.
